What is C.P.C.?

C.P.C. (Cooperation with the Professional Community) came into being in 1970 as an outgrowth of the Public Information Committee. Members of C.P.C. committees inform professionals and future professionals about A.A.what we are, what we can do, and what we cannot They attempt to establish communication between A.A.'s and professionals, and to find simple, effective ways of cooperating without affiliating. Cooperating with non-alcoholic professionals is an effective way to carry the message to the sick alcoholic. These professionals often meet the alcoholic in places and at times where A.A. is not present. A professional can be a family doctor or other health care professional, a member of the clergy, a law enforcement or court official, an educator, a social worker, an alcoholism or other type of counselor, or anyone who deals with problem drinkers in their work. Through professionals, alcoholics may be reached who might otherwise never find A.A.

BOOK PRICE INCREASE

On July 1 2005, the price of all books, with the exception of the Big Book-*Alcoholics Anonymous*, will increase by \$1. This increase applies to books of all languages and formats, including hardcover, soft-cover, large-print, and booklets. The various formats of the Big Book will remain at the current price.

A.A. World Services has also implemented a service charge on all orders. These measures along with other cost cutting at the General Service Office have been established to insure a continuing healthy Prudent Reserve.
