## Public Information Participation - Hempstead Health Fair on AA's 71<sup>St</sup> Birthday

Last month another AA member and I volunteered to cover a public information commitment for Nassau Intergroup at a Health Fair in Hempstead on AA's 71<sup>st</sup> Birthday – June 10<sup>th</sup>. We were well prepared for the event with appropriate conference-approved AA literature, displays, an AA sign, a good measure of AA experience between the two of us, food, beverages, chairs, tables and a canopy to protect us from the sun. What we hadn't expected was a day of constant high winds even though we were prepared for the elements.

Nassau Intergroup's booth was visited by members of the public throughout this one day event. Many questions were answered; AA pamphlets, Nassau Intergroup business cards and meeting lists, also candy were freely available for anyone to take. We were amused that the Mayor wanted us to have our photograph taken with him at the booth. Of course we declined because of Tradition 11 even though he assured us the photograph would not be published. Again we informed him of our personal anonymity at the public level being compromised. Interesting enough the photographer understood why we declined. We were also approached by one of the visitors to the booth who offered to help Alcoholics Anonymous in Nassau County to receive government funding. Once again we declined explaining our history and tradition of self-support and of declining outside contributions.

This event, like many others, was an important opportunity for the general public to learn about Alcoholics Anonymous and where to find us. I am pleased to say Nassau Intergroup and Nassau General Service Group continue to enjoy a strong relationship of cooperation between the two AA entities.
