From the Treasurer: Use of Group Funds

Each group or service group makes its own decisions concerning how it spends its money. Hopefully these decisions are made in the light of Fellowship principles following informed discussion in the group's business meetings.

Most decisions are easy. A group needs to make provision for basic needs such as rent and supplies, including literature. Hopefully, there also will be support for the group's trusted servants, its officers, Intergroup Rep, and GSR. A prudent reserve follows. Funds accumulated beyond immediate need and a limited reserve are then usually passed along the service group chain to GSO, Intergroup, local area, county, and district General Service groups, apportioned as the group sees fit to demonstrate our connection to and support for the work of those service groups.

What about expenditures that do not fall comfortably into any of these categories? The question for instance is sometimes asked about using group money to support a group anniversary party, picnic, or similar event?

I suppose the answer for me at least in part goes to what expectations have we set up for the use of our funds when the basket is sent around? That would seem to generally be that we will use any contributions to support direct and indirect 12th Step work.

What about that group anniversary celebration? One might argue that the anniversary is indirect 12th Step activity in that it shows the newcomer that AA works. If we're not comfortable with that, we can pass a separate basket just for the anniversary. That way, anyone putting money in the basket knows exactly what he or she is supporting. Since we all draw the line on AA principles in action in different places, the point becomes to be up-front about what we are doing so individuals can decide where to throw their support.

In related matters, the members and groups in the county continue to generously support the work of Nassau Intergroup. Contributing members and groups should receive individual letters acknowledging each contribution. If you have contributed and have not received an acknowledgment, let me know. For groups at least, most likely the letters are going to the group's meeting place and are not being passed along there. Sometimes too I cannot distinguish between an individual or group contribution because of the way the check or accompanying note is written.

Hope this is helpful. Feel free to get back to me with any questions.
