From the Treasurer:

The Budget Process and Some Considerations

Tradition Seven suggests that "AA groups ought to be fully supported by the voluntary contributions of their own members." Our intergroup is fortunate to enjoy considerable support from county groups. The flip side to that of course is that we must be responsible fiduciaries for the AA dollars entrusted to us.

By way of process, our by-laws require that the Financial Review Committee prepare the yearly budget. Ordinarily, that budget is first presented to the Steering Committee, which may make recommendations of its own before the proposal is offered to the Reps meeting in November. Come December, the Reps meeting makes some further adjustments to the income and expense assumptions, and finalizes the budget. This then represents our financial plan for the coming year.

Going forward, in round numbers, we should be able to carry about \$10,000 forward in the general fund at the end of this year. For next year, income can be expected to be about \$60,000. That will provide us with about \$70,000 to work with without recourse to the reserve or reliance on funds being brought over from Literature or Institutions. On the expenditure side, there is a long list of things we need to do (things like rent, telephone and other utilities, office maintenance and repair, printing meeting lists, and insurance), and many things we'd like to do (like hold workshops and

seminars, and support the activities of our Standing Committees). Balancing income and expenses is a challenge because it means making choices, setting priorities.

As of right now, still in round numbers, the suggested spending for 2008 exceeds likely income and funds carried forward by about \$9,000. We can fall back on the reserve if we want. The challenge for us seems to be getting used to the idea of routinely make spending decisions in the light of income and reserve realities. If we continuously or frequently fall back on the reserve without intending to do so, I think that's a problem.

If you are not familiar with Intergroup's operations,

many services provided by your intergroup is costly. Come January, I'll publish a summary of the budget we pass this month.

From the 12th Step List Chair

Some of you may not know what a "12th Step List" is all about. Here's the explanation: the hand of AA is ready and able to reach out to the still sick and suffering by answering phones around the clock. After the Intergroup office closes at 5pm, all calls are forwarded to the home of the Nightbook operator, who is on call from 5pm to 9am the next morning, and who has volunteered to be on duty that night. Incoming calls may be a plea for help by an alcoholic who needs a helping hand or someone to talk to, or the caller may want to know the location of a meeting in the area. From personal experience, I can tell you it's very rewarding to be of help to someone who has nowhere else to turn.

The Nightbook operator asks the caller for his or her name, phone number, and location and assures them that they will receive a call from someone very soon. THIS is where the 12th Step List comes into play. The operator refers to the 12th Step List Book, finds a name and number corresponding to the caller's town (or nearby), and then calls the person listed. The AA member on the list, in turn, makes the call to the original caller – and a connection is made.

So *please* get your name on your group's 12th Step List. As you can see, it is an extremely valuable asset in helping another alcoholic with their sobriety. Many groups do not have an up-to-date 12th Step List. If your group needs blank sheets, they can be obtained at the Intergroup office. Forms should be filled out and sent to Intergroup.


