SERVICE AND RECOVERY

I've sometimes heard service beyond the home group derided as getting involved in "AA politics." Such an attitude seems to fail to appreciate the history, nature and import of AA service.

Bill W. notes that, "an AA service is anything whatever that helps us to reach a fellow sufferer. . . ." AA's rich service history starts with Bill reaching out to Bob. It continues with the start of home groups, publication of the "Big Book" and other early public information efforts, establishment of the first AA service office in Newark, NJ, and development of intergroups and the General Service Conference itself. (See, The AA Service Manual, pp. S1-S12 for Bill's full quote, and for more details on much of this history.)

These several milestones in AA history and the men and women who helped them happen served to create the AA you and I know today. My participation in the continuing rolling out of AA history is a privilege, and a debt I owe to my own continuing recovery and to the drunk who still suffers.

Selfishly, I know that much of the growth I have enjoyed in recovery has come through opportunities service has given me to "practice these principles," first in the forgiving context of my day to day AA dealings, and then, having hopefully learned from my inevitable mistakes, in all my affairs.

Dr. Bob, in his last message, reminds us that, "Our Twelve Steps, when simmered down to the last, resolve themselves into the words 'love' and 'service." He goes on to say that, "None of us would be here today if somebody hadn't taken time to explain things to us, to give us a little pat on the back, to take us to a meeting or two, to do numerous little kind and thoughtful acts in our behalf."
