AA was there and provided me with the glimmer of hope that I needed to go on. It has always been this way as long as I can remember, the hot line has answered calls for help and information 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year and for that I will always be grateful.

My questions then to all of you reading this are as follows...when was the last time you or your group took the night book? When was the last time you were down at the Intergroup office?. Are you involved doing service? If not, then why not? On two weekends this month we had problems getting volunteers to answer the phones during the day and we need your help. This past weekend I had the honor of filling in on the phones and got the call from a young man who asked where he could sign up for AA. I spoke with him for a few minutes, provided him with meeting information local to his home and wished him well. When we hung up I said a prayer for him hoping that he makes it, remembering that I once stood at that very same turning point. This is what it's all about, providing this vital link to the alcoholic that still suffers, I pray to God we always can.

From the First Vice Chair— Tradition Five

AA's Traditions represent the experience, strength and hope of the "children of chaos" based in the trial and error of the formative years of the Fellowship, codified and documented by Bill W., first in a series of articles in the AA Grapevine in the 1940's, and later in the book Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions. The non-binding principles reflected in our Traditions are guides to harmonious and effective group life disregarded at a group's own peril. Tradition Five, in the long form, "Each Alcoholics Anonymous group ought to be a spiritual entity having but one primary purpose—that of carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers." tells us all we need to know about why we are here. We of AA have become privy to an answer to the age old problem of alcoholism. Passing that answer on to fellow sufferers is the reason for being for any collective calling itself an AA group. Doing so as individual members, we find as Bill W. did close to 75 years ago, is also the only way we can keep this precious gift. In this context, Bill talks about the "compulsions of selfpreservation, duty and love." In his "Big Book" story. Dr. Bob too talks about his reasons for "passing it on" including a sense of duty, a way of paying his debt to those who helped save him, and as a way of taking out some insurance against a slip. In order not to lose our way, we are admonished to keep to what we know. We are neither physicians nor ministers, social workers nor counselors. We are not experts in finance nor are we experts of any other kind. We are simply drunks who have found a way out. It is that way out that we share.

Hope this is helpful.
