
June AA History

From the First Vice Chair—AA's 75th Anniversary

AA formally marks its founding not from the date of the meeting of Bill W. and Ebby T. in the kitchen of the brownstone at 182 Clinton Street, Brooklyn where Ebby told Bill of a spiritual road to recovery from alcoholism, nor does it mark its founding from the fateful first meeting of Bill and Dr. Bob S. in Akron on Mothers Day 1935. We mark the beginning of AA from the date of Dr. Bob's last drink, June 10, 1935.

Every five years since 1950, AA has observed it's anniversary with an International Convention. That fist International was held in Cleveland (registration was about 3,000 and cost \$1.50), and was notable for Dr. Bob's Farewell Message to the fellowship wherein he admonished us to "not louse it all up" by failing to keep it simple. "Our Twelve Steps . . . resolve themselves into the words 'love' and 'service.'" At the second International in 1955. in St. Louis, AA is said to "come of age" with the hand off of the mantle of leadership from the early members to the General Service Conference. At the third International in Toronto in 1965, the "I am responsible . . ." declaration first appears.

This year AA celebrates 75 years of recovery. We celebrate the unbroken chain of one

drunk reaching out to another to share what we have found in and through AA, the chain of recovery, unity and service which reaches back to the co-founders, and to the struggles of the early members. That celebration will take place everywhere we find AA in the world today, but formally, it will take some of us to San Antonio, Texas, July 1-4, for our 13th International Convention. Tens of thousands of AA's and AA's friends are expected to be on hand. (Some 37,000 are pre-registered at this time.) It should be some celebration! For those who cannot be on hand in San Antonio, there will again be an anonymity-protected broadcast of the opening flag ceremony, and souvenir editions of AA Comes of Age and the Grapevine.
