My sober date is November 3, 2009. In the last nine months I have gone on roads trips to Key West and Provincetown, gone boating, swimming in the ocean, been to restaurants, museums, art exhibits, concerts, movies, several barbeques and AA events such as group anniversaries and local conventions. I plan on going canoeing next week. I never did these things when I was drinking. I never even made it to the beach last summer because I was too hung over during the day. What I thought was fun was a wasteland of empty bottles and not knowing where my money went. My bar friends never call me now and I don't want them to.

I take my sobriety very seriously and practice my program by going to a lot of meetings, having a commitment at my home group and go out on speaking engagements. I am working the steps with my sponsor and also attend a Big Book study every week. Sobriety is serious business but it should also be fun.
