But I'm no longer new to AA, and the once reasonable time for selfish ignorance and simply taking from AA has long since passed.

As we move into the end this year,we also come to the end of the current service rotation at Nassau Intergroup. We give our thanks to all who have or will have served during any part of the term 2009-2010. The membership often takes your quiet service for granted as I once did, but you know the joys, challenges and personal benefits of service beyond the home group.

# From the Nightbook Chair - Nightbook

A long time ago I can recall reading that there are no "musts in AA" ...but as a sponsor put it "Love and Service are vital to our existence" (thank you Pat). It is through the Nightbook that I find opportunities to provide just that love and service to alcoholics who reach out for help everyday. I am grateful to God for having sent me in this direction, to be able to help. For those of you who don't know, our answering service is totally volunteer operating 24 hours a day 365 day a year. During the daytime hours volunteers answer the phones from the intergroup office and at night AA groups volunteer a week a year, each individual member taking an evening of answering the phone from 5 pm till 9 am following morning. We provide information on everything from meetings to detox units and everything in between, sometimes being the last call a struggling alcoholic makes prior to picking up that drink again.

I know from everything I've read and seen that this alcoholic disease will never rest. It waits, it's patient, it's like a jackal that will eat you alive; the word for it is insidious. This is the very reason why it's so important to always be ready when anyone anywhere reaches out for help. This is the duty we are charged with ... let's call it part of the admission price to our new life.

When our co-founder Bill W asked his spiritual advisor Father Dowling...Is there any rest...ever? Father Dowling told Bill "no, not ever". I believe Bill took him at his word, as up to the time of his passing he never rested.
