"Regional Forums originated in 1975 at the suggestion of Dr. Jack Norris, then Chair of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous. They were to be weekend sharing and informational sessions designed to help the General Service Board, AA World Services, Inc., the Grapevine Corporate Board, the Grapevine Staff, and the General Service Office [GSO] Staff stay in touch with AA members, trusted servants and newcomers to service throughout the AA service structure." While GSO is conveniently located in our backyard on Riverside Drive in Manhattan, these Forums offer an exceptional opportunity for members to spend time with board members and staff not afforded even by a visit to GSO. There is no registration fee for participation at a Forum.

The next Northeast Region Regional Forum (NERF) will be hosted by Massachusetts (Areas 30 and 31) in Sturbridge the weekend of May 20-22, 2011. Go for the weekend or go for the day on Saturday. ### 25 And Counting

I am sitting here reflecting on my upcoming anniversary. It seems that every year about a month before my anniversary I start to get a little antsy. I am not sure why that happens. I think maybe it is the fact that I have a fear that I will not make it to my anniversary sober. Strange how this feeling overcomes me but there it is.

I also start to think about how it was for me when I first came into the program. I was sure I did not need the program. I drank daily and my life was totally out of control. Everything was crashing in on me. I drank daily but did not think that it was much of a problem. It was only when I was confronted with my drinking and taken to my first meeting that the light went on in my head. I sat in utter fear that someone other than the person who brought me to my first meeting would talk to me. I sat in the rooms for months never uttering a word or telling anyone my name. But I was not drinking and that was the good news.

One day at a meeting I heard my story and that very day I raised my hand and had to admit that I was an alcoholic. It was the hardest thing I ever did but I finally did it.

So much has changed in my life since I first walked into the rooms. I feel better about myself. I had a zero opinion about whom and what I was. That is not the case today.

In a couple of weeks I will be sitting in a room with my AA brothers and sisters celebrating my 25th anniversary. What a miracle. I have to thank my Higher Power and the person who first brought me into the rooms. I also have to thank all the people who have been a part of my recovery. Without the fellowship I don't know where I would be, certainly not where I am today.
