## From The Chair The Only Copy of the "Big Book"

This month Nassau Intergroup hosts its annual picnic in Eisenhower Park. (Our thanks to John K. for securing our permit with Nassau County.) On that occasion Alcoholics Anonymous will be on public display, each of us participating becoming perhaps the only copy of the "Big Book" a given member of the public may see. (Everyone around us may not know who we are, but many certainly will.) Any consideration or courtesy we show other users of the park, our respect for the park itself including how clean we leave the grounds when we go, will reflect on AA as a whole. Similarly, any misbehavior, any foul language we may use, not removing our cars from the grass when asked to, any trash we may leave behind when we go, will also reflect on all of AA.

Please keep this in mind as you enjoy yourself at our picnic. If we each mind our behavior and police our space before we leave (if you brought it in, either bring it out or place it in a proper trash receptacle when you leave), AA will be well represented.

The same holds true for how we handle ourselves in and around our local meeting places. I've been on hand as members cursed up a storm within earshot of a Rectory bedroom window, disturbed church neighbors, and when we left a trail of cigarette butts or coffee cups to mark our comings and goings. Groups have been asked to leave their meeting spaces, even after many years in a location, because of similar problem behavior. But it doesn't just reflect on those individuals or those meetings or groups. It reflects on AA as a whole because non-AAs do not distinguish between individual members - who we understand may still have recovery work to do-or our groups, or the fellowship as a whole or program of AA. We reflect our principles in action or we do not. How AA is seen publicly impacts our ability to help the drunk who still suffers.

In other matters, we are looking into options for our quarterly Exchange Meeting as the Garden City Community Church is developing new programs which may preclude our use of their space going forward. Watch this newsletter for more information as it develops. We expect to have a new site by the September 17th Exchange.
