Anyone, anywhere...?



It's tough enough deciding to come to AA in the first place, so Nassau Intergroup is committed to assuring that individuals interested in attending AA meetings may do so without undue added difficulty. But imagine going to a meeting and finding you couldn't get in. Unfortunately, for members or would-be members who use a wheelchair, as well as for those who face lesser mobility challenges, this is often the case, even with groups listed in our meeting list as wheelchair accessible.

Intergroup uses the designation "WC" in our print meeting list and the wheelchair symbol online to designate meetings that have identified themselves as accessible using a wheelchair. (Intergroup does not police this leaving it instead to the group to say.) For Intergroup, wheelchair access means that an individual in a wheelchair is able to enter the meeting site and access the rest facilities essentially unaided. (This is a simplified understanding of wheelchair access, and doesn't include all ADA specifications.)

Starting a new meeting or relocating an existing meeting? Please consider wheelchair access when you seek a meeting site. If your meeting is currently listed as accessible, please make sure it in fact is. (For example, if your meeting has a mechanical lift for access to the meeting space, does the lift work and can the group actually use it?) If your group is not listed as accessible, but you think it is, let Intergroup know. Wheelchair accessible meetings are few. Changes to access information should be submitted to Intergroup using the "Meeting List Changes" form (check off "Handicapped Accessible"), available online and in the office. Unsure if your meeting should be considered accessible? Contact the Intergroup Special Needs Committee, and we will provide more information to help you decide.

God of My Own Understanding

It is difficult to imagine my life without the AA Fellowship and the program of recovery that Alcoholics Anonymous has so beautifully outlined for me. I'd have to say that the greatest gift AA has given me is the freedom to search for and discover a God of my own understanding. No one ever pressured me into religious traditions or challenged my spiritual beliefs; instead I was encouraged to be willing, to have an open mind, and to accept the idea of a power greater than myself. And as promised, when I sought my Higher Power, God revealed Himself to me.

"We work together to have an experience that will move us...."

One day I came across a message from a retired Episcopalian Priest, John Shelby Spong. His message wasn't about AA, but I believe what he shared describes our fellowship so well, that I wanted to pass it along:

"We are a community that takes people as they are and we walk with them into the mystery of God. There are no roadmaps. We can't tell them what they have to do. We can't tell them what the rules are to find God; they discover God as they go. We honor people's questions instead of pretending that we have the answers and we let people journey at different paces. We work together to have an experience that will move us in some way outside of our daily concerns and give us a sense of awe, wonder, connection, love; a personal experience of the Divine."

From the DCMC Nassau

This is the time of year when AA groups in Nassau County (and throughout North America) participate in decisions about important matters that affect our fellowship. In April, the Delegates to our 63rd AA General Service Conference meet to review, deliberate, and take action on matters of policy for AA in North America.

Each year an agenda is prepared by our General Service Office from suggestions made through our general service structure. Our Delegate for AA Area 49 (South Eastern New York, "SENY") has identified 10 items from the agenda about which she'd like our opinion and guidance. These include (in part): changes to Tradition Eleven, how we engage AA members in the corrections process, and adding an index to *Alcoholics Anonymous*.

Perhaps you have opinions on these and other matters under consideration.

Your group's *informed group conscience* is communicated to our Delegate through your group's elected General Service Representative ("GSR"). Your GSR, by attending Area Assemblies, Nassau County General Service meetings, and district meetings, can inform your group about 'important matters' in the fellowship— and communicate your opinions on them.

If your group has a GSR, please encourage them to share the Delegate's Questionnaire at a group meeting and communicate your informed group conscience to our Delegate. If your group doesn't have a GSR, please elect one and have them contact me so that they, and your group, can get connected to our fellowship's communication and decision-making process.
