Special Needs Questionnaire

The Special Needs Committee focuses on our primary purpose, to stay sober and to help others recover from alcoholism, but with an interest in those of us who may have difficulty getting to a regular meeting. There is a real need for us to make AA available to those who are physically disabled, have long term illnesses, are homebound, seniors, hearing impaired or sight impaired.

I have been told to make a gratitude list many times, usually when I am overly upset about something that is just not that big. Eventually, I get down to gratitude for my health. I do remember a few years ago going to meetings on crutches and in a wheelchair after a skiing accident. Only recently did I realize that I could get into my home group, Bayville Triangle, because there is a wheelchair accessible entrance on the side.

GIGO

Of the numerous services provided by Nassau Intergroup, the one that is utilized by more people than any other is our meeting list. These lists are essential to all of us, from the old timer with 40 years to the person looking to find their very first meeting.

We print and circulate 40,000 copies of this list every year here in Nassau County and the surrounding counties. In addition, we maintain two lists on our web site. There is one in the familiar layout of our printed meeting list, as well as a "searchable" version. Our on-line lists are visited almost 3,000 times every week.

In the searchable edition, you can search for a particular type of meeting, a meeting between certain hours on individual day(s) of the week, or even meetings within 5, 10 or 20 miles of a specific town or zip. This customized list can then be printed out so you can always have a list of your favorite meetings in your pocket.

So what does GIGO have to do with this? In the early days of the computer era (way back in the dim ages of the early 60's), this expression gained special meaning. GIGO – Garbage In, Garbage Out. If you enter bad or incorrect data, you get inaccurate results. In order to get good information out of a system, good information has to be input.

These meeting lists are only useful when the information is accurate and up-to-date. We have all experienced the frustration of getting to a meeting that started an hour earlier than we expected, or headed out to a meeting only to find that it is no longer there. This is an inconvenience to us as experienced members, think what this would tell a person heading to their 1st or 2nd meeting and finding that it wasn't there.

This is where you came in. With nearly 300 groups, hosting approximately 700 meetings every week, it is impossible for one person, or even a committee to verify all of this information. WE rely on YOU to provide us with the current and accurate information on the location and times of the meetings of your home group.

Any changes/corrections or additions to your meetings information needs to be submitted on one of our "Group Meeting Change Forms ". These are available in the office or online. Please be sure to fill them out completely and legibly. Once submitted to the office, changes will be reflected in the on-line lists, shortly and in the next printing of the list.

New groups are listed on-line right away, but must have been meeting for six months since the submission of the form to be included in the printed edition.

With your help, we can be assured of providing an accurate and up-to-date meeting list for everybody that might find a need for it.
