Kick Up Your Recovery!

We who are regular members of Alcoholics Anonymous do so with the goal of never having to drink again. Those of us who practice a traditional martial art do so with the intent of never having to use it!

I have been involved with Taekwon-do for more than 23 years and have been sober for 17 continuous years. The practice of Taekwon-do has brought me many, many gifts which has enhanced my sobriety and spiritual growth. Taekwon-do taught as a traditional martial art is about our moral development not competition or winning. Those arts which do so are referred to as combat sports. A traditional martial art is about centering one's self. When we become centered we become aware, and when we are aware we can be of better service to the needs of others. Through the regular practice of Taekwon-do we become healthier physically, mentally and spiritually in the pursuit of self-defense.

Our obligation as practitioners is to always stand on the side of justice regardless of the danger. By practicing on a regular basis, especially the patterns (prearranged movements that simulate offense and defense) we connect our mind and body in a unique way. This connectedness allows us to become more centered and we grow spiritually in the process!! To exert oneself physically in this manner causes the brain to release endorphins and the resulting calm also enhances our spirituality.

When I was drinking I was selfish, self-centered and lacking in discipline. Being a recovered alcoholic I strive to be selfless, other-centered and growing in self-control thanks to the program of AA. Taekwon-do has helped me enjoy those gifts and to grow as a person in ways that I never thought imaginable. In addition to the 12 Steps of AA, I live by the Five Tenets of Taekwon-do; Courtesy, Integrity, Perseverance, Self-Control and Indomitable Spirit. Regardless of your age or physical condition I would strongly suggest that you consider trying a traditional martial art!

I was taught the importance of commitments early on through this analogy: the chicken and the pig decide to have breakfast. The chicken brings the eggs, that's a job. The pig brings the bacon, that's a commitment. And there are no jobs in AA, only commitments. So when I found I could not fill my commitments, I had to step down, and realize that I could not take on new ones that require showing up on a consistent basis. So I do things like set up chairs when I'm in town, and buy the anniversary cards the group hands out. But five minutes ago I realized there was something else I could do: I could write. So I submitted something to the Grapevine and sent in this letter to Nassau Intergroup.
