Your group can help us decide on a future course by answering the following three questions:

- Does your group offer/use AA literature (books and pamphlets) and related items (any other items in the AAWS/AAGV catalogues)?
- 2. In the past, did your group get its AA literature and related items mainly from NI?
- 3. Would your group like to see NI return to making AA literature and related items available for sale?

Please return the answers to these questions along with any further comments to the attention of Literature either electronically (literature@nassauny-aa.org) or in writing to the Literature box in the office, one response per group please. We already have some feedback from some of the groups represented at the last monthly meeting, and will circulate these question again at the April meeting. Your feedback will help us set the course for literature at NI.




IT ALWAYS SEEMS LIKE TRUMPETS AND HORNS SHOULD BLARE OR ORGAN MUSIC LIKE IN THE MOVIES SHOULD PLAY WHEN STEP FOUR GETS MENTIONED. ALL TOO OFTEN THAT IS THE WAY IT FEELS FOR THE **NEWCOMER OR FOR THOSE TAKING STEP** FOUR FOR THE FIRST TIME. ALSO, ALL TOO OFTEN IT CAN BE A LITTLE LESS THAN HELPFUL WHEN OLD TIMERS SAY THINGS LIKE "JUST WAIT UNTIL YOU GET TO STEP FOUR!" **OR "MY STEP FOUR INVENTORY WAS 655** PAGES LONG!". THE NOVICE AND THE EXPERIENCED BOTH, ON OCCASION, CAN BE **GUILTY OF MAKING STEP FOUR MORE OF A** MOUNTAIN THAN A MOLE HILL. THE REALITY IS THAT IT IS NEITHER. IT ISN'T EASY, BUT IT ISN'T ALL THAT HARD EITHER. THE FIRST **FAVOR WE CAN DO OURSELVES IS TO** RECOGNIZE THAT THE STEP SAYS THAT WE NEED TO TAKE A "MORAL" INVENTORY, NOT AN "IMMORAL" INVENTORY. THE POINT OF STEP FOUR ISN'T TO MAKE US FEEL BAD OR TO HURT US.

STEP FOUR IS THERE TO ALLOW US, THROUGH AN HONEST SELF-EXAMINATION, TO BEGIN TO RECOGNIZE HOW SELF WILL RUN RIOT DROVE US TO ACT IN WAYS THAT WELL EXCEEDED WHAT OUR INSTINCTS COMPEL US TO DO: SATISFY NEEDS, WANTS AND DESIRES. AS OUR LITERATURE DISCUSSES. WE ARE TAKING A PERSONAL INVENTORY IN THE SAME WAY A BUSINESS WOULD, THAT IS, WE'RE LOOKING FOR THE GOOD PRODUCTS AND GETTING RID OF THE BAD ONES. Doing Step Four Properly can take a LOT OF THOUGHT, ENERGY AND EFFORT SO IF IT TAKES A WHILE TO WORK THROUGH IT, THAT'S OK, BUT WE NEED TO BE SURE THAT ANY DELAY IN WORKING ON STEP FOUR ISN'T A RESULT OF PROCRASTINATION, UNWILLINGNESS OR SIMPLY FEAR. THE BEST APPROACH TO DOING STEP FOUR IS TO SIMPLY MAKE A START. START TALKING IT THROUGH WITH A SPONSOR, READ THE BIG BOOK AND THE 12 AND 12 AND THEN SIMPLY PUT PEN TO PAPER. OUR PROGRAM TELLS US THAT IF WE ARE TO HAVE ANY LASTING SOBRIETY, WE MUST HAVE A PSYCHIC CHANGE AND STEP FOUR IS THE FIRST PHYSICAL AND TANGIBLE STEP TOWARD THAT CHANGE.

LOOK AROUND THE ROOM AT ANY AA MEETING AND YOU ARE BOUND TO SEE PEOPLE FROM ALL KINDS OF RACES, RELIGIONS, AGES, GENDERS, ECONOMIC LEVELS AND PERSONAL EXPERIENCES.

WE ARE QUITE AN ECLECTIC BUNCH THAT MIGHT NOT ORDINARILY ASSOCIATE WITH ONE ANOTHER IF IT WEREN'T FOR OUR COMMON CAUSE. HEREIN LIES THE NEED FOR TRADITION FOUR: THAT EACH GROUP MUST REMAIN AUTONOMOUS UNLESS IT AFFECTS AA AS A WHOLE. WITH SUCH A DIVERSE CAST OF CHARACTERS AND OPINIONS TRYING TO ENSURE THAT ALL GROUPS FOLLOWED A DETAILED AND RIGID SET OF STRUCTURES WOULD SURELY FAIL.

TO GET A SENSE OF HOW DIFFICULT THIS **WOULD BE, JUST ATTEND ANY BUSINESS** MEETING AND SEE HOW HARD IT IS TO KEEP A SINGLE GROUP FOCUSED AND THEN IMAGINE TRYING TO GET ALL AA GROUPS TO ACT IN UNISON. IT SIMPLY WOULDN'T WORK. MEMBERS WHO HAVE BEEN FORTUNATE ENOUGH TO ATTEND MEETINGS IN OTHER STATES AND EVEN IN OTHER COUNTRIES ARE QUICK TO POINT OUT THE LITTLE DIFFERENCES FROM MEETING TO MEETING, BUT THEY ARE ALSO QUICK TO SAY HOW, NO MATTER WHERE THEY'VE GONE, THEY HAVE STILL RECEIVED THE AA MESSAGE AND FELT WELCOME. SO, THE BEST PATH FORWARD FOR AN ÅÅ GROUP IS TO NOT FOCUS SO MUCH ON LITTLE DETAILS BUT TO INSTEAD REMAIN FOCUSED ON THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF AA: HELPING EACH OTHER TO STAY SOBER ONE DAY AT A TIME BY FOLLOWING A BASIC SET OF PRINCIPLES AS OUTLINED IN OUR TWELVE STEPS AND TWELVE TRADITIONS.




1980--Central Office Nassau moved to a new office in Hempstead. The groups at that time having the courage to change followed their Higher Power's guidance and become the Nassau Intergroup of Alcoholics Anonymous. Nassau Intergroup was serving 153 groups and answering 1000 calls month by volunteer group members.

1989—Nassau Intergroup outgrew the office they occupied in West Hempstead. With continued use on the Serenity Prayer, Nassau Intergroup moved to a larger office in the same building.

1996—As of this writing (5/96), Nassau Intergroup serves 298 groups. We are all volunteering, fully self-supporting through contributions from our groups. We continue to maintain a 24-hour hotline staffed by a volunteer group member since 1977.

We distributed **90,000** meeting lists last year at no charge. We publish a monthly newsletter. We have an active Cooperation with the Professional Community, Public Information Committee and Speaker's Bureau. In October of 1994, the institutions committee serving Nassau, left New York intergroup and became Nassau intergroup's largest standing committee. The Nassau intergroup institutions committee brings AA. Meetings to over 25 hospitals detox facilities, rehabs, and the jail in Nassau County every day of the week brings AA meetings, **May 18, 1996 was our 19**th share a day.

## **NIAA Institutions Committee**



It's that time of year again - flowers begin to bloom, birds start singing again, we have more daylight than darkness & the ever-dreaded spring cleaning. But have we forgotten something? A reminder from the 4th month of the year, that daunting task, where we "made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves".

Ah yes, Step 4. How soon we forget. When for ourselves the days were cold, looking in the mirror we saw horror, a ghost, a mere shell of a person & we decided to make a change. So; we leave our old life behind us. Like lightening & thunder we were ready to move heaven & earth to live, breath & love, not merely exist. What I've learned so far in AA is that I can't do this alone. I'm going to need serious help. I need a sponsor, not people passing judgement. Only with those whom are caring, compassionate & helpful. Yet, sometimes I still feel like I'm swimming in the depths of the ocean. I'll do whatever it takes patience, perseverance & peace and not being hypocritical or egotistical. I don't want to be invisible. Break me down and build me up. I'm waking up; I feel it in my bones. I love how it feels without the chains, breaking out of prison, working on something I'm proud of. Getting out of the box that I was locked up in, I feel it in my bones, the sun's on the rise. It's a new age; I'm going to live in this world. I'm not a catastrophe. Look into my eyes, I'm hurt not broken, I'm not going to hide the truth anymore, I'm going to fight the demons inside. I'm going to be a warrior, prove to myself that my spirit hasn't died.

So how do I get from Step 4 to H&I, continuous sobriety. You see H&I's primary purpose is to bring meetings into those who can't get out to meetings. Example, those folks in hospitals, jails, institutions, rehabs, an detoxes, and the VA & psych wards. Our goal is simple, as stated in Step 12 – "Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of the steps, we try to carry this message to other alcoholics & to practice these principles in all our affairs".

Tradition 5 – "Each group has but one primary purpose – to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers". It's with the help of volunteers that we can accomplish our goals & have experiences.

H&I is always looking for people with an interest or desire to help, please reach out to us. The 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday of every month at 8pm, at the Intergroup office (361 Hempstead Tpke, W. Hempstead). This meeting is to meet with reps, fill vacant speaking commitments, distribute conference approved literature, newsletters, meeting books & this meeting is used as a forum to discuss any issue of importance to the committee. I am very passionate about H & I.

I came to AA via detox & rehab. Those speakers were an integral part of my sobriety & saving my life. Many of us came to AA the same way & have an experience encounter with an H&I speaker. Hence these encounters provide treatment of acute symptoms of the disease, we here at AA can provide.

What we provide is information and an introduction to a broader AA community needed to get well & remain clean & sober. Finally, to all groups & individuals who participate, respond to requests for donations, the speakers, the chairs who hold the meetings, arrange & book speakers as well as carry the AA message, your Experience, Strength & Hope are noticed.
